**Font Style :** Times New Roman, Font Size 12, Line spacing: 1.5 line Space, Margin : 1 inch in right, left, top and bottom, Format: Microsoft Word 2007 or MS Word 2003

**Number of Words/Pages:** Within 2000 words/ Five Pages including Title, Abstract, Tables and References
