
Resource person: Ms Kiruba Munusamy, Advocate at Supreme Court & Founder of Legal Initiative of Equality.


Few important points discussed in the webinar:


- ➤ There are 6 Human Rights according to our Indian Constitution
 - 1. **Right** to Equality,
 - 2. **Right** to Freedom,
 - **3**. **Right** against Exploitation,
 - 4. **Right** to Freedom of Religion,
 - 5. Cultural and Educational Rights, and
 - 6. **Right** to Constitutional Remedies.
- ➤ Article 32 provides the right to Constitutional remedies which means that a person has the right to move to the Supreme Court (and high courts also) for getting his fundamental rights protected. While the Supreme Court has power to issue writs under Article 32, High Courts have been given the same powers under Article 226.
