Karalapakkam Village Development Project – Report

The following Programmes were carried out at the Karalapakkam Village Development Centre, Karalapakkam by Madras School of Social Work.

Inauguration:

A formal inauguration was done on 18th August 2018 by the Principal along with 36 faculty members and Village Committee Members.





Rural Camp:

The students of BSW Batch 2016 – 18 conducted a rural camp at Karalapakkam from 03rd August to 07th August 2018. 42 Students of BSW Department were participated in this Camp along with 2 Professors Mr. T.Rufus Singh and Mrs.P.Vinitha. The purpose of the Rural Camp is to expose the students to rural life and they carried out various programmes such as Awareness programme on ill effects of alcoholism and Self Help Group Enhancement, skill development programmes for Unemployed Youth at Karalapakkam, Medical Camp, Tree Plantation and Workshop for Women on Embroidery and Wall Painting. A study on the Socio – Economic Conditions of Karalapakkam & Keezhkondaiyar Village, Thiruvallur District was also carried out by the students during the Rural Camp.





Republic Day Celebration:

Republic Day Celebration was organized at Karalapakkam Centre on 26th January 2019. National flag was hoisted by the village committee members in the morning and in the afternoon games were conducted for the children in the village. 47 children along with two tuition teachers

Ms.Kavitha and Ms.Padmaja participated in the Programme. Children expressed their talents through singing, story telling, narrating poems and performed folk arts.





Medical Camp:

A Medical camp on general health was organized at Karalapakkam Village Development Centre, Karalapakkam on 31.01.2019 in coordination with Rotract Club of MSSW. Two Doctors and Two nurses from Rotary Club of Avadi were present for the camp. 150 Members from the community including women, children, School Teachers and elders were benefitted out of this camp. Basic Check up including Height, weight, Blood Pressure and sugar level check up were done and related tablets and tonics were given to the community people.





NSS Special Camp:

The NSS Unit of Madras School of Social Work organized a 7 days Special Camp from 10th Feb 2019 to 16th Feb 2019 at Karalapakkam. 50 NSS Volunteers actively participated in this Camp. Various activities such as awareness programmes on Menstrual Hygiene, HIV/AIDS, Dengue, Addiction and Alcoholism, Personal Hygiene, Good Touch / Bad Touch, Street Play on Child Marriage, Tree Plantation, Medical Camp, Veterinary Camp, Eye Camp and Workshop on "Finance Management" for SHG Members.





Research Work:

A survey on "Study on the role of youth and women on developing the community at Karalapakkam Village" was done by the PG Department of Development Management students Ms.Krishna Shree, Ms.Dhivya and Ms.Sangeetha at Karalapakkam as part of their Internship Programme for 22 Days in the month of February 2019. A short study in Karalapakkam mainly focusing on emerging action plans for the development of the Karalapakkam Centre was done by 3 2nd year students namely Mr.Durairajan, Mr.Joel and Mr. Murali of PG Department of Development Management in the month of May 2018 as their Summer Internship.

Awareness Programme for Elected Representatives and other Functionaries of PRI's on Issues of Senior Citizens

One Day Awareness Programme for Elected Representatives and other Functionaries of PRI's on Issues of Senior Citizens was held on 21st February 2019 (Thursday) at the Karalapakkam Village Development Centre in coordination with Dr.Gangadharan from Heritage Foundation. 30 Participants from the different sections of the Karalapakkam Community participated in this programme.





Summer Camp:

A summer camp was organized at Karalapakkam Village Development Centre, Karalapakkam from 30th May 2019 to 01st June 2019 (3 Days) for the Children aged between 4 to 14 at Karalapakkam with the following objectives.

- To engage the kids in activities that they find both enjoyable and meaningful
- To give them an opportunity to learn and develop skills like Painting, Craftwork, Dance, etc.
- To provide an even platform for all kids to explore and express their creativity, in any form



AWARENESS PROGRAMME ON SUICIDE PREVENTION:

On 05.11.2019 Madras School of Social Work, Karlapakkam Village Development Project conducted an awareness program on suicidal prevention at the village development center.42 women were participated in this programme.

Target Group: women

Resource person: **Mrs. SAVITHA** a senior volunteer who have been involved in suicide prevention for the past 30 years.

Purpose of this program:

Suicides rates: 4 persons committed suicide and passed away for the past one year from September 2018 to September 2019, at Karlapakkam.

The Madras School of Social Work decided to conduct this awareness program. The program was organized in partnering with **SNEHA** is an organization working for suicide prevention. **SNEHA** currently submitted **National Suicide prevention strategy to the Union Ministry of Health and Family welfare for its approval**.

PROGRAMME SEQUENCES

1.<u>INTERACTION WITH WOMEN</u>: Resource person begin the session by interacting with participants

Reasons for suicide in the village

- Alcoholism
- Love failures
- Family dispute
- Debts
- Depression

- Forced marriage
- Parents scolding the children
- Emotions leading to suicide

2.INPUTS GIVEN BY THE RESOURCE PERSON:

- *Suicide thoughts*: Some people not able to cope with depression and making self-decision to commit suicide.
- Signs of suicide: Resource person said According the psychiatrist doctor" *Person will plan for two weeks before when they taking self-decision to attempt suicide*".

During the two weeks the following signs are:

- ↓ No proper intake of food
- Don't have proper sleep
- **4** Being withdraw and unable to relate
- **4** Being isolated and lonely
- **4** Express feelings of failure, uselessness, dispiritedness
- ↓ lack of hope
- ♣ Loss of self esteem
- 4 Constantly dwelling on problems for which there seems to be no solutions.

3.FACILITATION:

• Resource facilitated the session on "how women can help others in preventing suicide "

Following action plans are

- Identifying persons having sign of suicide
- > Have a continuous dialogue with person those who are having signs
- Refer them to the hospital
- Access to help line numbers

ATTEMPTED SUICIDE CASE – ACCESS TO HELPLINE

DATE: 18.11.2019

DAY: Monday

Confidential matter

One of the participants of the Prevention of Suicide Awareness Programme approached the center and shared the testimony of the attempted suicide case. She requested the Project Coordinator to maintain confidential.

About the attempted case: One of her brother in law age 62 retired bus Conductor from the Metropolitan Transport Corporation attempted suicide on last week. His character is good, no bad habits and no remarks in his service. After his second daughter's marriage he had financial constraints and he could not able to repay the debts that he brought for his daughter's wedding. He tried to hang himself at the fan and finally neighbours approached and rescued him and admitted at the private hospital

After the treatment he was recovered and psychiatrist advised his family members to change the environment. His elder son and younger son willing to take financial burden of the father and repaid the debts. After suicidal attempt, victim seeks counseling through SNEKHA help line number. Now the victim living with his younger brother house at Thiruvallur and living a happy life

CASE TWO- SUCCESS STORY

SUICIDAL ATTEMPT WAS STOPPED- Confidential

Date: 08.01.2020

Day: Wednesday

One woman age 53 working in MGNREGA (100 days of work) shared her testimony. She had a quarrel with her husband due to family problem and her husband is also an alcoholic. She could not able to tolerate word spoken by her husband during the quarrel. Immediately she become depressed and decides to attempt suicide. She brought pesticides from nearby shop at the village

and mixed with cool drinks. She yet to drink and suddenly she recalled the speech given by the resource person during the programme. Next movement she decided not to drink the pesticide. She really thanked Madras School of Social Work and the resource person from the SNEKHA

STAKE HOLDER DISCUSSION – informal discussion not official

Stakeholder: Government PHC nurse KADHAVUR - 08.09.2020

The nurse told that suicidal rates were reduced when we compared to the previous years

Suggestions:

- PHC nurse suggested conducting awareness program among men because suicidal rates were increased among men in the village
- **09.08.2021:** Government School Teacher suggested Madras School of Social Work to continue the awareness program with Minimal number

- Low hyper tension and high hyper tension
- Diabetes for both old age as well as middle age
- Mild hemorrhage due to old age
- General illness like cold, cough, body pain and fever

- <u>*Feedback*</u> was collected from senior citizens participated in the camp on 31.03.2020. Senior citizens appreciated Appreciated the College and hospital for organizing the camp, requested college to conduct eye camp for further eye checkup.
- <u>Home visit</u>: Project coordinator made home visit to the patient house on 31.02.2020. Collected previous medical history of the patient and enquired about his health problems. Majority of patients are taking treatment from primary health center, General Hospital Chennai and private hospitals. The camp medical officer suggested continuing these medications prescribed by the concern doctors from various hospitals.
- <u>Discussion with K.C. hospital</u>: Project coordinator discussed Kuppan's case to Mrs. JYOTHI LAKSHMI (Public Relationship officer of the hospital) through phone on 31.02.2020. PRO gave hospital phone number to register the patient details with the receptionist. Patient provided with small acknowledgement slip for future reference.

30.01.2021: After the camp the above patient approached the Project Center and discussed with the Project Coordinator for further medical intervention for his complaints. Project Coordinator planned to visit the patient's home for further investigation on medical History

<u>HOME VISIT – 1</u>

Date: 31.01.2020

Project Coordinator visited his home and enquired about the patient's health problems and also verified previous medical records

Summary of medical records

Medical History: Before 3 years ago the patient took treatment at K.C hospital (Hospital conducted the camp on 30.01.2020). Patent is in under medication **Following health complaints**

- **HT/DYSLIPIDEMIA** (an abnormal level of cholesterol land other lipids also called fats in the blood)
- t2/Flair Hyperintense lesion: White Matter hyperintensites(WMHs) are lesions in the brain that show up as areas of increased brightness when visualized T2— Weighted Magnetic Resonance Imaging usually occurred MRI of older patients

DISCUSSION WITH HOSPITAL

Name of the Hospital: KC hospital (conducted camp at the center)

Date: 01.02.2020

Telephonic conversation with PRO: His medical records history was discussed with PRO (Public Relationship Officer) of the K.C Hospital (conducted camp at the center) for further treatment. PRO put forth the request to the Chief Doctor and doctor permitted to give concession for the patient. Concession details were updated to the patient and his wife.

After two days received phone call from the hospital the patient is not turned up for the treatment

HOME VISIT-2

Date: 06.02.2020

Through home visit the project coordinator able to identify the reasons for not accessing the hospital

Following reasons:

- Patient and his wife are alone
- Not able to travel in the public transport
- Lack of money for medical investigations and medicines

Patient decision: Finally, patient decided to take treatment at the Government hospital

Follow up was stopped: Further follow up with patient was stopped due to lockdown during pandemic

17.08.2020: Again the Project Coordinator meet the patient and counsel him to take treatment either in Government hospital or private hospital. But patient didn't cooperate with the project coordinator because he had fever of coronavirus and hesitate to go for hospital. After a month patient was good and did his routine work

PATIENT DIED

DATE OF DEATH: 26.10.2020

Around 9.30 pm the patient vomited blood and had continuous cough. His wife and neighbors took him to the nearest private hospital located at the town, where there is no facilities and referred to the tertiary hospital at the city where he was declared dead

Statement given by his wife during home visit on 28.10.2020

Case termination: Patient Mr. Kuppan was not cooperated with Project Coordinator and hospitals for treatment. After the death of the patient the case was terminated

Other patients having Non Communicable Diseases decided to take treatment at the Government hospital and other private clinics located at the clinic.



FACILITATION OF STUDY ON THE IMPACT OF COVID- 19 AND 1918 PANDEMIC (HINI) VIRUS

SECTION A: EXECUITUVE SUMMARY

Key findings from the study:

- <u>Awareness level</u>: Village people are aware about precautionary measures to prevent corona virus. Government functionaries educated people on the prevention of corona virus. Children are following precautionary measures like wearing mask, maintaining social distance, and hand wash. People were not aware about schemes introduced by the union Government with specific to **five tranches of ATMANIR BHAR BHARATH ABIYAN** which was announced during COVID-19.
- <u>Challenges:</u> Education challenges are difficulties in accessing online classes, education material for the current academic year. Health challenges are access to emergency medical services, access to tablets and drugs, corona virus test. Loss in Rural economy due to the break in the agriculture supply chain, job cut in the farm sector, financial constraints. Psycho Social challenges are family conflicts, delivery for pregnant women because they are having a fear of corona virus infection. Water crisis in the village during lockdown. No computer facilities in the village to apply e pass and Government schemes through on line

• <u>Measures to combat challenges:</u> Preventive measures like awareness program, Community Health survey by women SHG'S, planning to set up computer at the panchayat office and 2 bore pumps will install and pipelines will be repaired.

SECTION TWO: BACKGROUND OF THE STUDY

As per the Instructions from the **Ministry of Human Resource Development, University Grant Commission,** Madras School of Social Work conducted the study '*Facilitation of study on the impact of COVID 19 and 1918 pandemic (HINI) VIRUS*" at the Karalappakam panchayat, where college is currently running an outreach project called **KARLAPAKKAM RURAL DEVELOPMENT PROJECT**. The project activities are tuition center, awareness program, and formation of women SHG'S, Medical camp, COVID relief work.

Objectives of the study:

- To study on the awareness level among people regarding COVID -19
- To study on challenges faced by village during COVID- 19
- To study on the measures adopted by the village to combat challenges

AREA OF THE STUDY: KARLAPAKKAM PANCHAYAT, AMBATTUR BLOCK, THIRUVALLUR DISTRICT, TAMIL NADU STATE.

SECTION THREE: RESEARCH METHODOLOGY

- Method: Qualitative methods like FGD'S, interviews and telephonic interviews
- **Participants:** Women involved in 100 days of work under MGNREGA((Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act) ,Women SHG'S, Children and village leaders
- Sample size: 25 women from 100 days of work, 15 women SHG'S, 7 children, 3 village leaders, and I ICDS(Integrated Child Development Services) Government pre school
- Date of data collection: 17.06.2020
- Data collection: Discussions were recorded by using android mobile

• **Data analysis**: FGD recorded data was analyzed with the help of 7 parameters framed by the FGD Research Specialist **MR. RICHARD A.KRUEGER.**

Following parameters by MR.RICHARD A. KRUEGER

- Words used by the participants during discussions
- Context (one is participant response and another one is comments from the another participants)
- Internal consistency
- Frequency or extensiveness,
- Intensity
- Specificity
- Finding big ideas

SECTION FOUR- MAIN FINDINGS OF THE STUDY

Theme 1- AWARENESS LEVEL REGARDING COVID-19:

- Village people are aware about precautionary measures like hand wash, social distance, and wearing mask to prevent corona virus. Government service providers both Block Development Office and Government Primary Health Center created awareness on COVID 19.
- <u>Awareness by media</u>: Children are following precautionary measures like wearing mask, hand washing, and maintaining social distance. Children are watching awareness programmes in televisions related to COVID 19. **PROJECT SECRETARY** of **KARLAPAKKAM RURAL DEVELOPEMNT PROJECT** said "*Media is playing a vital role in creating awareness about COVID-19*".
- <u>People's mindset in wearing mask</u>: PANCHAYAT PRESIDENT said "People having mindset there is no corona virus transmission in the village so they are not wearing mask while doing farm work, when people those who are going outside from the village for jobs they are wearing mask".
- Usage of Sanitisers: People in the village are not affords to buy sanitizers because it is costly, Instead of Sanitisers people are using soaps and turmeric water to wash their hands

- <u>Awareness for old age</u>: GOVERNMENT PRESCHOOL TEACHER said "Old age people in the village are not following any precautionary measures so we should educate them".
- <u>Aware of Government schemes</u>: General finding people are not aware about the schemes introduced by the Union Government with specific to five tranches of ATMANIR BHAR BHARATH ABHIYAN like loan benefits for famers by NABARD(National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development), Mudra shish loan, Kisan rath, and farm gate infrastructure.

Theme 2 -VARIOUS CHALLENGES POSED BY COVID 19

EDUCATION

- <u>Children's future education</u>: Mothers in the village are worrying about their children's education in future because already academic year was started. Women are eager in reopening schools
- <u>Access to online coaching</u>: Children are studying in private schools are able to access online classes, but children studying in Government schools find difficult in accessing online classes, because there is no android mobile facilities available with their parents One of the worker from 100 days of work said" *Even though there is an availability of online facilities, children are not listening to the classes this creates mental stress to parents*"

Children are worrying about books for the current academic year. One girl said "I do know which book I should study for this academic year"

• Parents find very difficult to pay fees for their children studying in private schools.

HEALTH:

 <u>Access to emergency medical service:</u> There is no medical emergency facilities are available at the Government primary health center. People have to travel 14 kilometers to Avadi Government General Hospital or the District hospital at Thiruivallur which is located 20 kilometers away from the village

- <u>Access to tablets and medicines</u>: Patients those who are taking treatment at the tertiary hospitals like Institute of Child Health, Institute of Mental Health and Rajiv Gandhi General hospitals find very difficult to get their regular tablet and medicines during lockdown
- <u>Corona virus test</u>: Testing facilities are not available at the Government Primary Health Center. Private clinics are charging RS 500 for testing. It is very difficult for poor people and pregnant women from lower income group to pay fee for corona testing.
- Project Secretary of Karlapakkam Rural Development project said "There are no positive COVID 19 cases in the village". One flower vendor from the village was tested for corona because he went to Koyembedu market. His test turned in to negative, after that he was quarantined for 10 days at the hospital, even his family member's results were turned in to negative. Secretary also put forth reasons why there is no COVID infection in the village, because Houses are isolated and having less population, and people are breathing Fresh air so people are enjoying healthy life.

ECONOMIC

• LOSS IN AGRICULTURE ECONOMY:

Break in the Agriculture supply chain

- Loss of jasmine flower business: Koyembedu market (one of the huge market located in the heart of the city)) was closed because it turns in to major source for corona virus transmission this is one of the reason where farmers lost their income. Small farmers who cultivated flowers have incurred heavy loss. Usually May month will be the peak season for jasmine flower (people called this flower in Tamil "CHITHIRAI MASAM MALAR")
- <u>PRE COVID 19</u>: Framers from the village used to sell Jasmine flowers and vegetables in the Koyembedu market and they sold 300 grams of flower with cost of Rs 40 to 50. Panchayat President said" famers from the village lead a happy and satisfied life with the help of these business people saved money, rebuild their houses, conducted family functions, but now during COVID 19 income was huge loss"

- <u>DURING COVID 19:</u> One women said "we are selling 300 grams of flowers to the local buyers at the cheap rate of Rs 20 to 25 which is not sufficient to make profit and not able to pay wage for laborer's
- Job cuts in the farm sector: Laboures who worked in the field were lost their jobs due to the occurrence of low income in agriculture business

FINANCIAL CONSTRAINTS:

- <u>In sufficient Relief fund</u>: Rs 1000 provided by the Government is not sufficient to maintain family in all four cycles of lockdown.
- <u>No job and no income</u>: Due to COVID 19 men who worked as a temporary basis in nearby companies were lost their jobs, so there is no income in their families.
- <u>Restriction to work</u>: Based upon the new rule framed by the Government, Women those who are above 50 years were restricted to work in the 100 days of work MGNREGA (Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act) so these women are facing financial constraints.
- <u>*Repaying loans*</u>: Nationalized banks are not providing any grace time to repay their loan during the COVID 19. This leading to stress and pressure for women

PSYCHO SOCIAL:

- <u>Children's misbehavior</u>: Children at home are not listening to their parents, and they become disobedient this leads to mental stress among parents. One supervisor of 100 days of work said "*manage children at home creates tension and pressure*"
- <u>*Prevalence of family conflict:*</u> Conflicts happening between husband and wives. One man attempted suicide because he had quarreled with his wife.
- <u>Delivery for mothers</u> is the big challenge because mothers are having fear of Corona virus infection

BASIC AMENITIES

• <u>Water crisis</u>: Village faced severe water crisis in the month of March and April during lockdown. Due to this crisis there was a practical question rises without water how people will wash their hands during COVID 19 situation?

TECHNOLOGY

• <u>No computers and internet facilities</u>: People find very difficult to apply e pass for emergency purposes during lockdown because there is no computer and internet facility at the panchayat office. People need to go to main road for applying e pass. Now a day's Government regulated all schemes need to apply through online. There is no facility for famers in the village to renewal and apply for the kisan sabha one of the Central Government schemes for farmers.

VULNERABLE GROUPS

• Senior citizens need health care, food and psycho social support and sometimes financial support. Even persons with differently able need sane support

<u>Theme 3- MEASURES ADOPTED BY THE VILLAGE TO COMBAT CHALLENGES</u> <u>Preventive Measures</u>:

- Creating awareness among people especially people are working in brick industries and rice mills located in the village because they are exposing to dust and other infections.
- People should avoid crowed places like going to city or town because there is a huge chance of transmission of corona virus.
- Current situation needs to turn in to normal position then only people can go for jobs, to stabilize their livelihoods
- After situation turns in to normal position either Government or NGO'S should facilitate and start business pertaining to horticulture, floriculture, and vegetation in order to rebuild the village economy
- 10 Women Self Help Group members were trained to administer community health survey by the Department of Health and Family welfare. Group's role is to visit door to door and need to identify if there is any fever, cold, and cough cases. Women are getting RS 500 per day. This initiative was taken by the District collector

Measures taken at the Panchayat level

• Two bore pumps were laid and 500 pipelines were repaired with the help of councilor's fund

Future plans at the panchayat level

- Install another two bore pumps in the village with the help of block fund
- Get computers for panchyat but there is no funds to buy computers
- e-Sevai center at the panchyat office
- Planning to talk with Government medical officer to conduct camp once in a week.

SUGGESTIONS AND CONCLUSION:

Suggestions are:

- Create linkage between farmers in the village and District Agriculture officials like Joint Director of Agriculture (in charge of agriculture schemes) and Deputy Director of Horticulture. So that schemes introduced by the Government will be disseminated to farmers in the village.
- After COVID 19 further research needs to be done for enquiry the functioning of agriculture marketing schemes e- NAM(National Agriculture Marketing), Operation Green, Kisan Rath
- Create linkage between vendors to local nationalized bank so that they can access loan schemes like Mudra Shishu, loans for re setting small business
- Creating awareness among people especially people are working in brick industries and rice mills located in the village because they are exposing to dust and other infections. This was suggested by one of the women SHG leader during the discussion.

Conclusion:

• From this study we can conclude people in the village are aware of precautionary measures to prevent corona virus but they are not put in to practice typical example will be not wearing mask inside the village because they are having mindset there is no corona virus transmission in the village.

- People are facing different challenges posed by COIVD 19 but they are not clear about to take remedial measures to combat the challenges posed by COVID 19. People are very keen in taking immediate measures like spraying disinfection, creating facilities for people to access their needs, but they are not very clear about long term measures, but they need more facilitation after COVID 19.
- At this COVID 19 situation people are not thinking about long terms measures, but withstands for their day to day needs.

KARLAPAKKAM RURAL DEVELOPMENT PROJECT (OUTREACH PROGRAM COVID – 19)

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INTERVENTIONS DURING COVID – 19

Karlapakkam Rural Development Project is an adopted and outreach program of Madras School of Social Work, from 1979 onwards. During COVID 19, college provides various interventions for people in the karlapakkam village.

1 AWARENESS PROGRAMME COVID -19

On 18.03.2020 Wednesday Hand washing techniques were demonstrated to our tuition children at the center. Children were educated on the basic measures to prevent Corona Virus like wearing mask, hand washing, social distancing by using the pamphlet provided by the Ministry of Health and Family welfare. As per the Government instruction the center was closed from 20.03.2020 onwards.

2 RELIEF DISTRIBUTION

On 21.05.2020: 77 families including tuition children, people from village, our care taker and teachers were benefited through relief materials mobilized by the Madras School of Social Work, Society for Social Education and Research, Karlapakkam Rural Development Project. Relief materials which worth of Rs 47,200(Rs 600 per family for 77 families was raised by Mr. **SAMYUKTH (Second year PG Student from Department of Development Management and President and founding trustee of ARPANA Foundation).** Materials were transported to Karlapakkam with the help of district volunteers. Relief materials packet comprises of items: Rice 5 kg, Wheat 1 kg, Dal 1 kg, Oil 1 kg packet. Materials were distributed to families in the presence of Panchayat President Mr. Ramu, and Karlapakkam Rural Development Project Secretary Mr. Elango.

3 HEALTH INTERVENTION

NEED BASED SUPPORT

3.1 Medicines for Needy

Patients from the village including children, old age, differently able, and mentally ill who are taking treatment at the tertiary hospitals like Rajiv Gandhi Government General Hospital, Institute of Child Health, Institute of Mental health and other private hospital find very difficult to access medicines during lockdown. So, arrangement of medicines to the desired families was made.



3.2 Support interventions

Based upon the medical record and prescriptions, Project Coordinator collected medicines from

the Poonamallee Taluk Government General Hospital Sri Ramachandra hospital, and sent medicines to the concern patients in the village through speed post. Maintained a Follow up of the patient through mobile whether they received the medicines or not. 5 patients received medicines with the help of speed post during lockdown.





4 EDUCATION INTERVENTION

During lockdown period because of COVID 19, it is very difficult for children to access classes. However, children from the Village find very difficult to access online classes because their parents don 't have android mobiles to hear online classes. Based upon the initiatives taken by the Department of School Education, lessons were started telecasting in the Kalvi channel from second week of July onwards. Following interventions are:

4.1 Mobilization for kalvi channel

As per the Announcements made by the Government regarding kalvi channel, it was shared among parents of the tuition children. But after interacting with them we came to know that kalvi channel was not telecasting in the local cable TV channel.

4.2 Help children to access kalvi channel

Immediately we contacted the village president and put forth our request to make necessary arrangement about connecting the kalvi channel with the help of local cable TV operator. After two days channel was connected, children started watching Kalvi channel.

4.3 Day to day monitoring

Contacting the parents of our tuition children through phone and enquired about children watching kalvi channel.

4.4 Tuition classes

Finally, few parents requested tuition teacher to take class for children. The teacher started tuition for 7 children at her home in the last week of July. In the first week of August the strength was increased from 5 to 16. Revision test was conducted for children on a weekly basis.

4.5 Home Visit as helping techniques

4.5.1 Purpose of the home visit

Identifying children from Kandigai those who were already enrolled in our tuition classes in the month of February. Basic details were collected, the parent's names and their mobile numbers. Through home visit we came to know Children studying in Sevalaya School learning lessons from online and they are also watching KALVI channel.

4.5.2 **Stopped tuition classes**

Tuition teacher stopped classes, because nearby the teacher's house old man was died due to Tuberculosis. So, the classes were immediately stopped. So, children have continued their studies at home by watching kalvi channel and online classes.

4.5.3 Tele counseling:

4 Interns from the Department of Development management, MSSW interact with tuition 20 children and their parents through mobile on daily basis. Time schedule of lessons telecasting at Kalvi TV was shared with our tuition children. Interns are daily tracking tuition children through mobile about their daily learning and maintained the tracking sheet. Each Child's learning status was maintained in excel sheet on a daily basis.

4.5.4Sharing Lessons

Notes were taken from watching kalvi tv and was shared to our tuition children on daily basis.

The other members in the family were hardly interested in his garden. He often throught how his garden would be after he died.

4.5.4 Distribution of stationeries:

40 children received stationary items like 3 note books, two pens, 1 pencil and an eraser. These stationary items were sponsored by **ARPANA FOUNDATION** (a trust previously sponsored relief material to karlapakkam).

4.5.5 Home tuitions

In order to avoid gathering home tuitions were started for children. Precautionary measures like social distancing, wearing mask and hand wash were followed in home tuitions.

4.6 OUTCOMES OF THE INTERVENTION

Parents gave positive feedback that "By interacting with children daily, they are showing interest in studies" We thank tuition center for taking care of our children education".

- One participant came forward and demonstrated the various steps involved in selfexamination of the breast.
- Participants decided to share this information with other neighboring women and wanted to do self-examination on monthly basis.
- **Problem sharing:** At the end of the Programm one woman came forward and shared her problem with Mrs. Jayasree. The Woman involved in 100 days of work having a pain on her breast for the past one year and her periods cycle also irregular. Mrs. Jayasree recommended woman to go for test and do the necessary follow up. Another woman

expressed that her mother who is fifty-four years old her period was stopped before two years and recently she had a heavy blood flow"

Thilagavathy age is 43 living in Kilakonadaiyar village Karlapakkam panchayt. She is an Agriculture labourer and earning RS 150 per day based upon the availability of work in Agriculture. Her husband is a mason working in Avadi and other towns in around Karlapakkam. She is having two children elder daughter and younger studying in Karlapakkam Government High School and her younger son Prabha studying tuition run by MSSW.

She also learnt tailoring before her marriage and also worked as an assistant in Export Company. She is having a 20 years old sewing machine which is in bad shape and not able to operate, she can't able to stitch her clothes by using her machine. In the month of February, she attended oneday workshop on designer blouse organized by the Madras School of Social Work and she leant measurements and cutting. In the month of March, she started using the sewing machine at the Project center and initially she stitched clothes like blouse, lining works for her own use. For the next upcoming months, she is willing to take orders from neighbours

On behalf of her family she thanked MSSW for creating an opportunity to use the sewing machine for stitching.

COVID 19 SECOND WAVE RELIEF WORKS

Second wave lock down situation- Karlapakkam

The Government of Tamil Nadu announced full fledge lockdown from 10.05.2021 onwards. Due to this lockdown people in the village facing constraints during this period

Following constraints are

- No Employment: No transport, not going for going for work, this is one of the situations facing by villages that are going to work on daily basis. Currently women workers are currently working as labourers in jasmine gardens for daily wage.
- Agriculture loss: Agriculture commodities like vegetables, and fruits were not supplied to regular markets due to no transport, no labour work force due to fear of corona virus and very strict enforcement by police. Timings for running shop were further restricted from 12 to 10, this find very difficult for farmers to sell their agriculture products. Agriculture products like greens, vegetables and fruits are selling at very low cost. Perishable goods are decaying at fields.
- MGNREGA works are continuing without any breaks
- People also received Rs 2,000 as a relief amount From the Government
- Not able to access medicines: Senior citizens, people with mental illness and other illness not able to access medicines from towns and cities.
- Corona virus status as per 20.05.2021, 18 people turns positive cases as per the statement given by the ICDS teacher involving in taking survey on corona status. One 62 years old lady was passed away due to Corona virus
- Felt needs: Need provision items for beneficiaries who are lost their job due to lockdown
