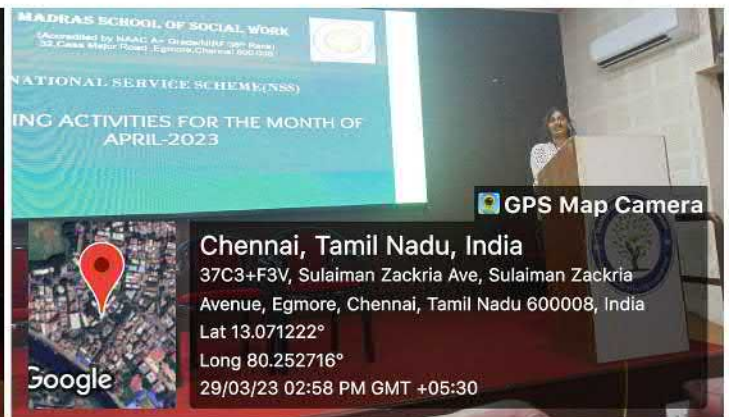
NSS Meeting


