Principal's Report



Warm greetings to all!

This year, though COVID played spoilsports, we were able to maintain the steady stream of regular activities and ensure that our students had all the required inputs for fulfilling their learning outcomes.

I am glad to present a few highlights of the activities of the College in the academic year. I am pleased to report that the College was ranked 4th Best College for Social Work education by India Today for 2021. The National Institutional Ranking Framework of the HRD Ministry ranked our College as 30th among all Colleges in the country.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE YEAR

- This year we had 798 students on the rolls for all courses. 68% of them are women students.
- 20 external experts were involved in curriculum development through the Board of Studies and Academic Council.
- Our students engaged with over 260 organizations for field work and internships.
- 12 State/National and International level seminars on an eclectic range of topics such as DeCoviding the HR Algorithm, Social Gerontology and Social Security measures for the Aged, Leveraging Sustainable Development Goals through Social Entrepreneurship, Journey of Healing, Inclusivity and the way forward and Entrepreneurship in Agriculture Sector.
- 236 persons visited the college or joined via online platform as trainers, guest lecturers and seminar as resource persons.
- 52 students participated in seminars and workshops outside college.
- 19 students participated in competitions outside college and won prizes.
- The NSS volunteers of the College have invested more than 7000 hours of work as volunteers in the community in support of various social causes.
- Out of the 53 members of the faculty, 24 have a PhD degree and 19 have MPhil degrees. 55 papers were published in various National and International Journals by the faculty members.
- Over 455 students were helped with scholarships worth Rs.27,63,500 in this academic year.

Principal's Report

- In the last year we have provided consultancy services worth of Rs. 1,03,73,340 to more than 12 corporate organizations and NGOs. Gandhigram Rural Institute (under the Ministry of HRD), State Child Protection Society, FICCI FLO, Central TB Division - Ministry of Health and Family Welfare Government of India, World Vision, Firmenich were some of the organizations we consulted for.
- Our faculty have obtained Central / State funding for the following research projects:
 - ♦ Use of E-Resources among the PG Students and Research Scholars of Social Work funded by Gandhigram Rural Institute.
 - ♦ Correctional Administration Issues and Remedies in the Rehabilitation of Inmates under ICPS – Stakeholders' Perspectives supported by State Commission for Protection of Child Rights.
 - ♦ Study on the determinants of Psycho-Social Wellbeing of Multi Drug Resistant Tuberculosis patients in Chennai and Madurai Districts of Tamil Nadu supported by Ministry of Health and Family Welfare Government of India.
 - ♦ Status of the eligible beneficiaries of Sponsorship and Foster Care of ICPS in Tamil Nadu supported by State Child Protection Society.
 - ♦ Research Study on “VPDP as a tool for Convergence & Holistic Development” funded by SIRD, Govt. of Tamil Nadu.
- We were contracted by the State Planning Commission to prepare the Strategic Plan of Tamil Nadu for the Agriculture, Industry and Social Sectors.
- A Social Entrepreneurship Incubation Centre has been set up through which projects related to Environment Protection, Child Rights, Livelihood Creation, and Handicrafts are being incubated.
- A Centre for International Collaboration has been set up to further collaboration with organizations abroad. An MOU has been signed with Trinity Western University, Canada and International Centre for Clinical Psychology and Psychotherapy, Germany.
- Through our regular Community extension activities we have reached out to communities in Chetpet, Otteri and Karalapakkam village to work on health, education and livelihoods. Hundreds of families who suffered due to the lockdown in these locations were provided with dry rations. A food kiosk has been set up inside the campus to support the livelihood of Transgendered persons.
- The counselling centre of the college has played a crucial role in helping people during COVID 19 by starting a Helpline through which 230 persons were helped.

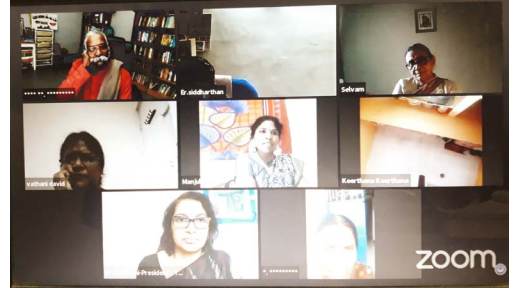
Social Gerontology and Social Security Measures for The Aged

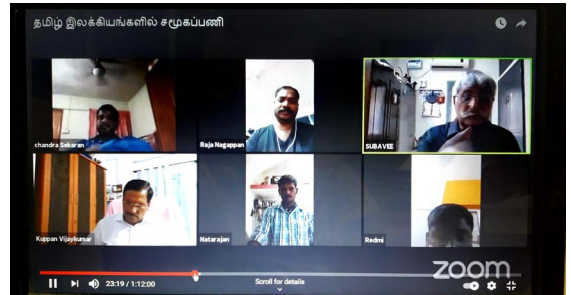

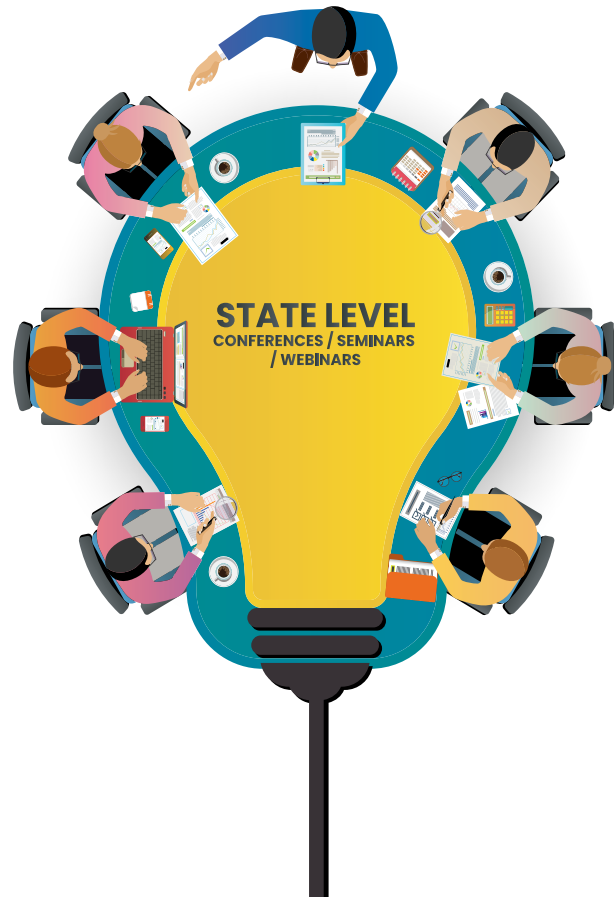

During the Covid-19 pandemic, the challenges faced by the organisations were immense. Dr. N. Audinarayana talked about the demography of elderly population. He listed out the major Consequences of Ageing - Changes in Age-structure, Changes in Old Age Dependency, Changes in Sex Ratio (Females will be Higher), Widows would be More, Changes in Living Arrangements, Few Children and/or Family Members to extend Care / Support. Dr. Sangeeta told about the roles of teachers in promoting elder care by encouraging younger generation to connect with elders, and by being a bridge between the young and old. She listed down the various measures that could be carried out by the teachers such as Facilitate discussion on family heritage, history and tradition, Organize exposure visit to senior living communities, Promote voluntary service to a senior centre, update themselves about many researches on elder care which will help them and us to understand their behaviour and needs.

Annual Athletic Sports Meet

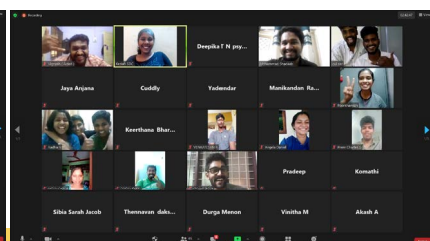
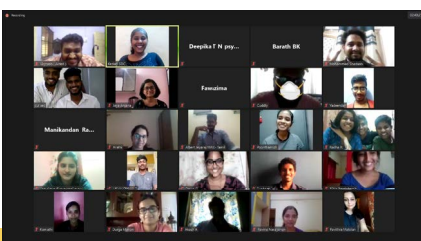


The Annual sports meet of MSSW was held on Sunday, the 28th February 2021 in the college campus due to the the Covid restrictions

Entrepreneurship Development Cell

The Entrepreneurship Development Cell (EDC) of the Madras School of Social Work in Collaboration with the Department of M.A. Human Resource Management has organized a one day - online workshop on 23rd April, 2021 on the topic, "A Walk-through session on Enterprising Entrepreneur" between 10 am to 5 pm. Dr. P. Mohana, Entrepreneurship Development Cell Coordinator & HOD of MAHRM Department welcomed the gathering. Nearly 85 participants from various departments of MSSW and different colleges attended the workshop. The workshop was conducted by the Expert - Mr. M. Shanmugam, Proprietor, Multipurpose Marketters.



Placement Cell

The Placement cell started its activities for the academic year 2020 - 21 by December 2020 and the placement brochure was released on October 2020. Placement cell contacted around 65 organizations during the academic year for both placements and internships and 31 organizations conducted selection processes, the processes were conducted either through offline or online and so far 70 graduands have been placed while few more companies are in the process of hiring more of our people. The average CTC for the year so far works to 4.75 LPA. Apart from final placements 8 students were selected for internships as well with an average package of INR 25k per month. We invite more companies to hire our present graduands and the process moves progressively.

Women's Cell

The Women's Cell of Madras School of Social Work celebrated the International Women's day on 8th March 2021, beginning with a series of competitions with the WHO International Women's Day theme, 'Choose to Challenge'. An online panel discussion was held as - CHOOSE TO CHALLENGE DIALOGUES to get together and discuss how to build a strong personal narrative and the 4Cs the levers for Success On International Women's Day. The moderators were Harshita Chaudhary -Tata Institute of Social Sciences Mumbai and Deepti Ravi, an ISB, Hyderabad. This was followed by a session on awareness and

demonstration on Self-defense using Karate by team from Shito Ryu International karate-do kai Lead by Shihan K. Shankar ; All India chief technical director 7th Dan black belt – Japan,affiliated with karate association of India. The Men faculty were sensitized and appraised from the day's events as bystanders and co-participants in everyday challenges of Women's life. This was followed by a chain of memorable celebrations and gifts were given to all the women in the campus.

Staff Welfare Association

He suggested some websites to check for authentication of information in order to avoid fake news during this covid-19 pandemic and introduced the cyber crime portal to the participants. Mr. Amit Gupta and Ms. Prerna Sharma were the other guest speakers whose speech created awareness among the students about recent trends in Cyber Security and to use Technology responsibly. Ms Ms. Prerna shared some websites where we can file our cyber security issues website for filing the complaint which has cyber crime reporting for women and children, this website also has an option to enroll ourselves as a cyber volunteer.

Alumni Association

The Alumni Association of Madras School of Social Work has been functioning as a supportive organ of the College and plays a pivotal role in pursuit of excellence in the field of higher education. During this year also, the Alumni Association actively raised funds to award scholarship to the needy students. 70 students have applied for the scholarship out of which 14 students were selected based on merit cum means and were awarded Rs.2,25,000/- as the scholarship amount.

Eco Club

The Eco Club of Madras School of Social Work observed World Environment day on 5th June 2021 by conducting an online contest - “Wealth out of waste contest 2021” in collaboration with Poovulagin Nanbargal. The contest comprised of three events, Go green (Poster making), Doodle eco (Doodling) and regard what you discard (Junk art). The primary focus was to create an awareness on environment sustainability through art forms. They had 121 registrations which was done through Google forms and a total of 65 participants took part in the event, out of which 2 participants were considered winners for each category. This event brought out the creative aspect out of the participants and made the event a successful one.

NSS

On 21st Feb 2021, 25 NSS Volunteers actively participated in the Chennai Book Fair – Mini Marathon namely “Run to Read’ organized by the Book Sellers And Publishers Association of South India at Elliots beach to create awareness on the importance of cultivating reading habits among youngsters. The NSS Unit of Madras School of Social Work organized a Guest Lecture and elocution Competition on the topic “India’s Freedom Fighters” on 12th March 2021 in an commemoration of prior celebration of India’s 75 years of Independence. International Youth Day, World Kidney Day, NSS Day and Martyr’s Day were also observed by the NSS Unit of MSSW. National Constitution Day or Samvidhan Divas was celebrated by the NSS Volunteers on 26th November 2020 to broaden the students knowledge about our constitution. 50 NSS volunteers participated in this programme.

42 NSS Volunteers took part in the Workshop on “Empowering You” conducted by Dr. Sumathi Chandrasekaran, Founder of Yuvathi – NGO and Mind Cafe. The purpose of this workshop was to maintain a positive mental health in a proper way during this pandemic.

MCJ Counselling Centre

MCJ counselling centre played an crucial role in helping people during COVID 19 pandemic by adopting activities such as started helpline and a panel of counsellors were available from 8a.m to 8 p.m. when lockdown was announced to help people overcome their fear and anxious about uncertainties. So far, they have received almost 230 calls from different parts of Tamil Nadu and few calls from other states of India. 80% of calls were related to problems with addictive behaviours. Few of the clients were referred to de addiction centres and clients who developed excessive physical symptoms due to addiction and other disorders were directed for medical help. Other clients were given relaxation therapy and components of cognitive and behavioural therapy.

Rotract Club of Mssw

The Installation ceremony of Rotract Club of Madras School of Social Work was organized on 03rd December 2020 through online mode. Our principal, Dr. S. Raja Samuel welcomed the Chief Guest Rotarian Bala Guru, the Guest of Honour Rtr.Anbuarasu and the special invitee Rtr.Kamuvel. The Chief Guest gave an inspirational speech to think and do things better. The Special invitee Rtr.Kamuvel urged us to do better as our predecessors have left a great example for us. New Office bearers of the Rotract Club were introduced and logo & tagline of the Rotract Club for this academic year were also released during the ceremony.

The Rotract Club of MSSW has conducted various events such as “Try Out’, Namma Yaru, Dry Run, Sagaptham, Mic Testing and Lead & Converse to make sure that every office bearer is aware of their duties, roles, responsibilities and to improve their leadership and Communication skills. Social Entrepreneurship Incubation Centre:

The Social Entrepreneurship Incubation Centre has updated its database by adding 35 Social Impact Organisations in Tamil Nadu were identified and mapped wherein incubatees, pre incubatees and students can visit/ enroll/ collaborate with. Each have been contacted for discussing collaboration initiatives. Directory of State, National and International B Plan competitions, Social B Plan fests, Summits, Crowdfunding opportunities and seed stage investors were created. 11 incubatee projects were mentored including 2 Student projects from students of BSW and MA HRM that were supported by our team wherein 2 months pilot project plan development and mentor support was provided. Both projects are currently in research stage.

SEIC acted as project consultant and submitted feasibility study project plans for 2 projects namely- Kalvarayan Hills Tribal Project and Kodaikanal Wild Coffee Enterprise Initiative. A “Coalition For Social Enterprises in Tamil Nadu” was initiated by the team of SEIC and MASE Faculties in order to connect with and map social entrepreneurship landscape and opportunities in Tamil Nadu. SEIC conducted various programmes such

as Finalisation of Cohort I Incubatees working on Environment Protection, Child Rights, Livelihood Creation, Equal Rights and Handicrafts - Application verification, B Plan submission and Orientation, Offline consultation on - Emerging need for an integrated shelter and housing policy for the urban homeless in Tamil Nadu, workshop on Design Thinking, 3 Day Online SE Bootcamp conducted for St Claret College, Bootcamp, 3-day camp at SLI, Auroville for green economy certificate course and so on.

This was executed during March 2021, for few days wherein the vagri people were invited to the college too for classroom training and the method involved displaying the various nutritional food through pictures and making the community people understand the nutritional value present in them and that making them understand the importance of having good and nutritional food especially for their children who may otherwise end up becoming children with malnutrition. Nutritional charts were prepared and were made to be displayed in their homes so that every time when they see the chart they would understand the types and methods of good and proper food for them and their children, this programme went well and nutshell also plans to cook such nutritional foods in their in house centre matching the charts that has weekly menu balancing the overall growth of the people, thus solving the nutritional social problem of a community people, a truly social entrepreneurial venture.

Art of Integrating Storytelling And Puppetry

Value added course on the art of integrating storytelling and puppetry was organized by the BSc Psychology program from 28th June 2021 to 5th July 2021. The 7 day course helped the students in learning the art of storytelling and express them through puppets which offers numerous advantages in education process & integrating the art of storytelling along with puppets opens the freedom to explore learning with creativity and develop inbuilt courage to express. The students were trained to design education scripts on different social awareness themes such as Child rights, Social inclusion, Sustainable Environment, Gender, Social ethics-against Corruption. Students were also guided to explore the contemporary form designing stories, education scripts for social awareness and to design low cost by using waste materials.

The resource person for this course was Mrs. Immaculate Mary, Educator, Curriculum Designer and a Teacher Mentor. She is a professionally trained Social worker and Child Psychologist, practicing in the field with more than 20 years of experience. She is assisted by two other resource persons, Ms. Shravani and Ms. Hulda.
