

Principal's Report

Warm greetings to all!



I am delighted to present a glimpse of the activities of the college for this year. This year has been significant to us in many ways inspite of the impact of COVID. I am glad to inform that we secured A+ grade with a score of 3.40 in NAAC Accreditation which is one step above our grade in the last cycle. We were also ranked 30th among all colleges in India by NIRF. These achievements were possible through the hard work of faculty, students, management, alumni, subject experts, resource persons and other stakeholders. We will march forward and reach the highest grade in the next cycle.

EVENTS

Though we were on campus only for three months, the year has been abuzz with all the planned activities.

- We had the full complement of 866 students of whom 71% were women students in the 10 programs affiliated to University of Madras. We received 3881 applications for the 395 seats at a ratio of 1:10. We have admitted students from 18 states of our nation which has truly enhanced the diversity in the campus.
- Nine national conferences were conducted on a variety of themes including Climate Resilience, Women in workplace, Reducing Inequality, HR flow in new Eco system, HR Symphony, Rural Development, Conversing Gandhi, Care of persons with intellectual disability and Youth and Well being. Apart from these 14 certificates courses, 21 workshops and 53 webinars have been conducted for the benefit of our students. Over 219 guest speakers and resource persons have participated in these events.
- As a college dedicated to social work, we are closely engaged with issues related to society not only
 in term of academics but also policy and practice. Last year we were part of Government Policy
 framing process in the areas of women, homeless, relocation and senior citizens.
- The year was a landmark in our extension activities. We have launched a Community College at Karalapakkam village to train women in Tailoring and at Kattur to train youth in plumbing. A unique food kiosk has been set up in our campus for providing livelihood to a transgendered person. Under the Social Entrepreneurship Incubation Centre, an outlet that provides livelihood support for two women with disability has been started in the campus. This outlet sells eco friendly products that support traditional livelihoods. The Youth Resource Centre conducted a special job fair for youth with disability in which over 40 were provided job offers. Apart from this 70 youth have gained employment through the centre.
- Our students have been active in curricular and co-curricular activities throughout the year. Over 244 students have participated in seminars outside college and 140 students have participated in competitions.
- Along with their academic responsibilities, our faculty members were active in research, training and consultancies for the Government and other sectors. Our faculty trained over 2700 employees of the Madras High Court on Gender sensitization. We provided training on Green Enterprises to 10 youth with intellectual disability. One of our faculty was involved in developing a training module on Public Relations for Police Personnel in partnership with Anna Institute of Management. We provided need based skill training to women & entrepreneurs in 18 districts of Tamil Nadu under TNSRLM / TNRTP projects.
- Our consultancy division has taken up CSR Impact Assessment of National Thermal Power Corporation and Kudankulam Nuclear Power Corporation projects.
- Our placement record last year has been spectacular with over 102 students placed with an average CTC of 5.7 lakhs per annum. Over 62 organizations have visited us for placements.

CENTRES FOR EXCELLENCE

The Centre for Social Entrepreneurship was active in conducting several boot camps and technical workshops on Social Entrepreneurship. One of their significant activities was imparting training for a Cohort of 10 youth with intellectual disabilities on Green Enterprises. Some of them have successfully taken up farming activities. The Centre also conducted a National level Social Pitch in which over 60 teams from all over the country participated. The newly started Centre for Ageing conducted training programmes with NISD collaboration apart from a program for managers of old age homes. The Centre for International Collaboration conducted webinars and initiated discussion with foreign Universities including Trinity Western University, Canada and Binghamton University, USA. The Centre for Digital Learning has initiated Moodle Learning Management System and also enhanced access to digital learning resources.

Climate Resilience and Sustainability:

The Social Work Forum of MSW Aided department conducted a National conference titled "Climate Resilience and Sustainability" on 1st April 2022. The resource persons invited for conference are Mr. Piyush Manush, Indian Environmental Activist, Dr. Anbumani Ramadoss, MP, Rajya Sabha, Mr. Darwin Annadurai, Founder and Managing Trustee of Eco Society India, Dr.



L.N. Jayanthi, Assistant Professor, D.G. Vaishnav College, Mr. Vetri Selvan, Environmental Advocate of the Madras High Court and Mr. Allan Ignitious Raj, Associate of Eco Champs, Bhumi.

The PG Department of HRM hosted their 17th Annual National HR Conference, HR Symphony'22 on 30th of March 2022. The 19th issue of HURECANE (HUman REsource CAmpus NEws) magazine was released by Mr. Amanpreet Singh Bhatia, President & Global Head of HR, Ashok Leyland Limited along with Mr. David Jayan Prakasam, Associate Chief Manager- HR, Godrej Storage Solutions. Two sessions of panel discussion ensued with various topics pertaining to the theme – EVOLVE (Enriching HR Values, Opportunities and Leading through Varying Environment). The 1st Panel discussion was accompa-

The Valedictory ceremony was facilitated by Guest of Honor - Mr. Dinesh Arjun, CEO - Raptee Energy.

A National level Webinar was organised by The UG Department of Psychology marking the "World Mental Health Day" which was observed on the 11th of October where we had Assistant professor from the Delhi University to talk about the Neuro-diversity under the theme of the year, Mental health in an unequal world.





The Annual Seminar, AXIOS 2022 was organized by B.Sc Forum, 'Elysium' on the 8th of April 2022. The topic chosen for the Seminar is Youth and Wellbeing: Nature the Future. There were four speakers for the day. Ms. Pallavi Rajankar, Counselling Psychogist who spoke on Yogic practices and mental wellbeing. Dr. Kailash S, Psychiatrist who spoke on Digital addiction among youth, Dr. Siva prakash, Psychiatrist, who spoke on Sexuality and mental health and Dr. Sangeetha Makesh, Counselling psychologist who spoke on Relationships and boundaries.

The PG Departments of Social Entrepreneurship and Development Management conducted a Special Lecture, in association with the strategies to Mitigate Flood and Water Scarcity in Chennai on 22 November 2021. The event focused on the preservation of water usage, clean water, the importance of water, the connection of water in nature, and the current situation in India. Honourable chief guest Thiru.Justice.S.Baskaraninaugurated the event and emphasized that the statemust take necessary actions to provide the healthcare and medical support to its people as it is considered to be avery basic human right of every individual. Various resource persons such as Mr.Henri Tiphagne, Executive Director -People's Watch, Mr.Thirumurugan Gandhi - Human rights activist and activist Mr.A.Muthukrishnan and Mr.Kannan, Joint Secretary General, CITU also addressed the gathering.


